Assistance Towards Home Repair, etc., for Earthquake Victims



Assistance is being provided to help cover the repair fees, etc., for homes affected by the March 16th Fukushima Offshore Earthquake. Application forms are distributed and received at the Construction and Housing Department (on the 2nd floor of the City Hall's Central Building); application forms are also available for download from Date City's homepage. Roof Replacement Expenses Partially Subsidized

Date City will partially subsidize owners of buildings within the city for necessary expenses incurred during roof replacement.

[Subsidy Details] 23% of eligible expenses will be reimbursed (up to ¥552,000) ** Eligible expense limits are as follows: either an amount that equals ¥24,000 multiplied by the area of the roof in square meters (m²); or a total of ¥2,400,000 [Eligibility] Households which have received a Disaster Certificate for the 2022 Fukushima Offshore Earthquake, with an assessed damage level of Portional Damage or greater

[Subsidy Requirements] Either of the following conditions must be fulfilled:

- ① Repair of the entirety of a tile roof, conforming to national standards
- ② Replacement of a tile roof with a metal roof, etc.

[Number of Subsidies] Subsidies will be granted to approximately 10 households (for the first round of applications)

[Application Period] Beginning May 30th, applications will be accepted on weekdays between 8:30 AM and 5 PM

[Necessary Documents] Disaster Certificate; a copy of a repair estimate with itemized expenses; a diagram which confirms the area of the roof, etc.; photographs taken prior to repair work (showing extent of damage to the roof tiles)

Temporary Home Repairs

Households affected by the Fukushima Offshore Earthquake can have a portion of their home repair expenses subsidized.

[Subsidy Details] Quasi-Partial Destruction ··· ¥300,000

Partial Destruction or greater ⋅⋅⋅ ¥595,000

[Eligibility] Applicants must fit both of the following criteria:

- ① Households which have received a Disaster Certificate, and whose disasterrelated damage has been judged to be at the level of Quasi-Partial Destruction, Partial Destruction, Mid- or Large-scale Partial Destruction
- 2 Households repairing parts of a damaged roof or external wall

[Application Period] Applications currently accepted (for the time being) on weekdays, between 8:30 AM and 5 PM

[Necessary Documents] Disaster Certificate, and photographs taken prior to repair work

[Important Note] This is a program in which Date City pays the repair contractors directly. This program cannot be used if you have already paid for the repair work.

Support for Repairing Homes with Portional Damage

Subsidies will be provided to households who have undertaken repair work on roofs or exterior walls, etc., which have been damaged by the Fukushima Offshore Earthquake.

[Subsidy Details] ¥100,000

[Eligibility] Households must fit both of the following criteria:

- ① Households which have received a Disaster Certificate, and whose disasterrelated damage has been judged to be at the level of Portional Damage (damage to a home which has not reached the level of Quasi-Partial Destruction)
- ② Households which have received damage to their roof or exterior wall, etc., and whose repair expenses have reached or exceeded ¥200,000

[Application Period] Applications currently accepted (for the time being) on weekdays, between 8:30 AM and 5 PM

[Necessary Documents] Disaster Certificate; repair work contract (or repair estimate); receipt; photographs taken before, during, and after repair work



Supporting the Livelihoods of Newly-Married Couples!

In order to reduce the financial burden of marriage upon newly-married couples, subsidies will be provided to help cover the expenses related to obtaining a home, paying rent, moving residences, etc.



[Expenses Eligible for Subsidy] The following expenses are eligible, when paid between January 1st, 2022, and March 31st, 2023:

- ① Home acquisition expenses (when either purchasing or building a home)
- ② Home renovation expenses
- 3 Rent, security deposits, key money, communal property fees, broker fees
- 4 Moving expenses

[Eligible Subsidy Recipients] Married couples who meet all of the following conditions:

- ① Couples whose marriage registration has been submitted and accepted between January 1st, 2022, and March 31st, 2023
- 2 Newly married couples whose combined income is under ¥4,000,000 (excluding any amount used to repay student loans)
- 3 The subsidized home is within Date City
- 4 Both husband and wife are age 39 or younger on the day of their marriage registration
- ⑤ On the day of application, the address on the Certificate of Residence of at least one member of the couple is the same as the subsidized home
- 6 There is the intent to live at the subsidized home for at least three consecutive years from the day of application
- 7 Neither member of the couple are behind with municipal taxes
- ***** Other conditions apply

[Application Period] Applications accepted from June 1st, 2022, to March 31st, 2023 (As there is a limit to the budgeted amount, the program may end partway through the fiscal year)

- Dropping off and picking up children from childcare facilities and educational activities


Family Support Center Operational Mechanism
