We all scream for ice-cream!

What comes to mind when you hear the words "a vehicle playing something from speakers as it drives around?" In Japan, there are probably many people who would think of emergency services vehicles, political campaign cars or mobile billboards. How about if the question was changed from "playing something as it drives around" to "playing music?" I imagine there are many raised in Japan who would answer with "vehicles selling roasted sweet potatoes."

If you ask people from the United States, Canada, and some countries in Europe, however, I am sure many of them would answer "ice-cream trucks." As the name suggests, these are vehicles that sell ice-cream. They play music as they slowly drive around so that children, often playing outside, can hear them. Unlike the vehicles selling sweet potatoes, which usually play a style similar to enka (a traditional genre of Japanese songs), ice-cream trucks play a fun

and energetic tune that appeals to children. Not knowing when the ice-cream truck will appear gives it mystique that further bolsters the excitement when one finally hears it! In addition, ice-cream trucks often carry icecream and popsicles that aren't easy to find otherwise. A favorite among kids in particular are popsicles made to look like famous movie or TV characters.

My summer vacations as a child have been tinged with memories of catching the icecream truck's tune playing on the wind, and desperately running to ask my mom for money. Even now as an adult, whenever I hear that nostalgic tune, I get the urge to run outside.
